a show a performance (music, theatre, ballet, opera)

a hotel a place to sleep

Which hotel do you stay in when you travel?

a musician a person who makes music

He works as a musician. He plays the guitar.

all over in many places

You can find them all over the city.

originally from the beginning

He is originally from Texas.

sometimes not all the time

Sometimes I like to take my car to work. Sometimes I like to walk.

wake up to get up from sleep

I like to wake up early when I travel.

a plane an airplane

The plane leaves very soon.

although conjunction meaning to contrast, (like but)

Although the plane is faster I still prefer to take the train.

I eat at the restaurant.
I don't eat at home for lunch.

Do you eat in restaurants?

When

Use the present simple for habits and things that do not change.

Structure

I walk / you walk / he walks / she walk / it walks / we walk / you walk / they walk

Negative

I do not walk / you do not walk / he does not walk / she does not walk / it does not walk / we do not walk / you do not walk / they do not walk

Interrogative

do I walk? / do you walk? / does he walk? / does she walk? / do we walk? / do we walk? / do you walk? / do they walk?

Contraction

do not = don't does not = doesn't

Examples

Shanghai is in China.

I work at IBM.
