I have / you have / he has / she has / it has / we have / you have / they have

Negative

I do not have / you do not have / he does not have / she does not have / it does not have / we do not have / you do not have / they do not have

Interrogative

do I have? / do you have? / does he have? / does she have? / does it have? / do we have? / do you have? / do they have?

Contraction do not = don't

does not = doesn't
