PHRASE BUILDERS 1

Possible questions

What questions will the journalist ask? He will ask what do you do? He will ask who do you work for? He will ask where do you work?

What will Jack Smith say to the journalist?He will say he is a photographer.He will say he works for a newspaper.He will say he works in Switzerland, Austria, Germany and Poland.
